COURSES OFFERED BY SUBJECT

ENGLISH / LANGUAGE ARTS

These courses stress vocabulary, reading comprehension, and a writing process focusing on skills from pre-writing to publishing. Spelling, grammar, usage, capitalization, punctuation, and composition skills are taught at the grade-appropriate level. Handwriting, keyboarding, test-taking and study skills are integrated into each course.

ELA 091 - KINDERGARTEN ENGLISH/LANG ARTS - 1ST SEM 0.5 CREDIT
